AND THEN RUBBERS OF EVERY CONCEIVABLE STYLE, HE CARRIES IN STOCK ALL OF THE WHILE; THE SNAG PROOF RUBBER OF RUBBERS IS KING, AND FOR THE BUSY LABORER IS QUITE THE PROPER THING.
