Thank You Members for 2023, Help Needed for 2024!

As 2023 rolls to a close, a hearty thank you is shared with all members and donors! Memberships continue to be steady. Volunteers have been awesome. Donations and memberships need an increase.

The Board of Directors recently was forced to act with the never popular task of raising membership dues. Dues have been held constant for over 20 years. The dues seen on page three reflect these increases. The society has been blessed with increasing membership over this period of time. Likewise, more historical programming has also evolved. Today, we see (15) colorful life size silhouettes sharing Brighton's history in the downtown; (163) restored headstones now stand tall in the Old Village Cemetery, having been freed from the sod that clutched them toward their broken demise. A recent 2023 award from the Michigan Historic Preservation Network for the outstanding volunteer effort in the Old Village Cemetery restoration is validation to the quality of work and programming provided. The Lyon Schoolhouse has been updated in the classroom and museum room. Displays have been refreshed. The archive room is in the early stages of total revitalization due to the new software that will catalog all collections and identify their specific location. CoBACH Center displays and exhibits showcase multiple aspects of our community and its proud history. We count our blessings with our dedicated and involved volunteers that keep the continuing, informative exhibits, along with archiving and restorations in motion. The awesome deck of downtown historical playing cards required extensive research from the society and significant amounts of time from partner, Denise Murray of the Brighton DDA, who implemented the funding, printing and the free card give-away with the merchants. These complete decks of historical cards will now be sold for a very reasonable \$10 a pack, starting in November by the BAHS.

The historical society knows the enjoyment that community members receive in seeing old photos and learning about Brighton's early days. The Facebook postings from Brighton Area Historical Society have over 4700 followers and is proof to the value and interest in local history.

Annual operational expenses have seen large increases. Monthly newsletter printing and postage rates have seen the same significant upward increase as the rates for the society's electric and gas utilities. Insurance rates covering both the schoolhouse and CoBACH Center have more than doubled in the last (15) years.

But what has not changed until now is the increase in annual membership dues. The society is so very thankful for the many individuals and businesses that have paid upfront to become lifetime members. These onetime monies funded many capital improvements over the years at the schoolhouse. These improvements in some cases need updating every decade or sooner. What is the current source for these maintenance funds?

This brings us back to the issue of operational expenses. More memberships, increased annual dues, and donations from our friends and lifetime members are needed. Will you please consider an increase in your donation or membership for 2024? Remember all officers and directors receive no salaries or funds of any type for the work we love to share with the community. The Brighton Area Historical Society is a 501(c)(3) tax exempt organization and your membership dues and donations may be tax deductible.

The following is the story about the Brighton Veterans' Memorial located in downtown Brighton by the Mill Pond. Thanks to all those who made this memorial possible.

Brighton Veterans' Memorial

A Veterans memorial is a tangible representation of a much larger ideal. It is a place to give a community a way and to show acknowledgement and reverent appreciation to those who have served our country and for those who have died in service. It's a place of humble gratitude for their sacrifice and a place of reflection for their loss.

Brighton has been honored to have a memorial, a grand rock with a plaque that was installed at the Mill Pond in the 1950's. In an effort to upgrade the current memorial to world-class status, a small group of community members consisting of Ricci Bandkau, Bryan Bradford, Dennis Nauss, Chad Cooper, Piet Lindhout, Dick Price and the Brighton Senior Men's Club undertook this project. All veterans groups in the area took an active role in contributing to the design and backed its redesign when presented to the City of Brighton where it was received by unanimous approval.

Organizers said local contractors donated \$80,000 worth of labor to build the Brighton Veterans' Memorial in seven weeks; no dollars from taxpayers were used.

With a vision of a beautiful testimonial to the bravery of the soldiers who served, the existing memorial was moved to a new circular site. The new site features shiny granite on a raised circular base that holds the original veterans' rock, brass service medallions and flags for all six military branches, as well as the American flag surround the site. It has brick pavers with the names of those who served their country. (Additional engraved brick pavers can be purchased through the Veterans Memorial Committee.) Approximately 972 bricks engraved with veterans'

names have been installed at the site. Culminating in stately and proper memorial to those we honor.

Thousands packed the Brighton's Mill Pond area on November 9, 2013 to attend the official unveiling of this world-class memorial that a community built.

Surrounding the memorial is a garden maintained by the Brighton Garden Club. The club is honored to have designed and has continued to be responsible for maintaining this outstanding memorial garden. This garden was awarded first place in 2015 by Michigan Garden Clubs, Inc.

Please note that Commemorative Pavers may be purchased by any individual to honor a United States Veteran, who was honorably discharged, and will be placed at the Memorial on the "Veterans' Walk of Honor", or an area nearby as expansion allows.

Thank you to all who participated in this wonderful project.
